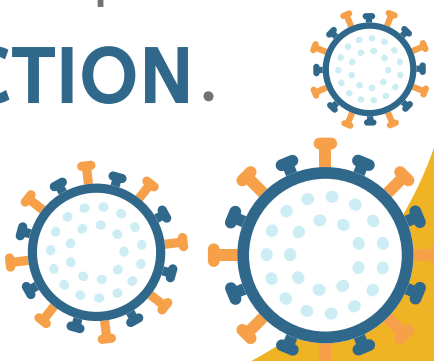

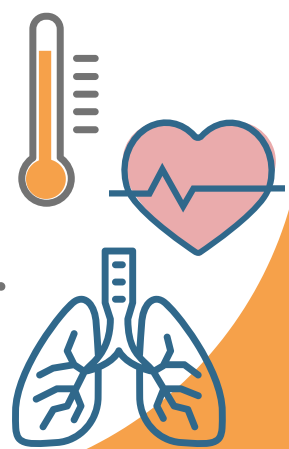
FIRST DO NO HARM

weakens immune protections.

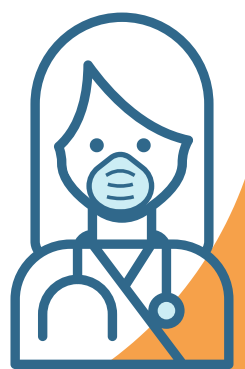


SEPARATION
